Youth Opportunity

\$48,000 contributed to helping young people reach their full potential

- **85+** students attended after school and summer camp programs
- Training and resources for coordinators and mentors who serve **900+** at-risk high school students in Ellis County
- Scholarships for over **30** children to participate in scouting activities

Financial Stability

\$71,000 towards creating a stronger financial future for every generation

- **811** homeless individuals received assistance with food, gas, phone minutes, car payments, and bus tickets
- **50** families facing eviction or needing housing assistance were able to stay in their homes
- **115** families received utility assistance
- **40+** single, divorced, or suddenly widowed women received mortgage, rental, or car payment/repair assistance
- Over **90** individuals were provided safe housing, financial literacy services, and savings programs

Healthy Community

\$86,000 given to improve the health and wellbeing for all individuals

- **446** seniors were provided daily healthy meals, socialization, and transportation assistance through local senior centers
- **120** widows received community support, education, and hot meals
- **443** Ellis County seniors received a hot meal and a well check every week day
- **273** individuals received weekly mental health services
- **52** individuals with disabilities received access to specialized socialization programs
- **544** individuals received safety and services after fleeing domestic violence situations

Community Resilience

\$8,000 to address urgent needs today for a better tomorrow

- Support for **51** households affected by disaster in Ellis County
- **603** individuals trained in CPR, first aid, and AED
